Jesus' love for His Disciples

Jesus' disciples were discouraged and filled with fear. In John 20:19, we learn that many of the apostles were hiding after Jesus was crucified. However, Jesus spent 40 days with the disciples to not only prove he was alive but to encourage them and strengthen them for the task ahead. Specifically, Jesus spent 40 days with the apostles:

Jesus commissioned his disciples, to go and make other disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. Acts 2: 38 reveals the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, and that name is "Jesus" of instruct his disciples: During this time, Jesus continued to teach and instruct his disciples about the kingdom of God and the mission they were to carry out.

To commission his disciples: Jesus commissioned his disciples to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

To prepare his disciples for his ascension: Jesus spent this time preparing his apostles for his departure, encouraging them to continue in faith and to await the coming of the Holy Spirit.

1. Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand;
2. By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain.
3. For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;
4. And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:

9. For I am the least of the apostles, that am not meet to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.



10. But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.
11. Therefore whether it were I or they, so we preach, and so ye believed.
12. Now if Christ be preached that he rose from the dead, how say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead?
13. But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen:

14. And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain.

17. And if Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins.
18. Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished.

19. If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable.
20. But now is Christ risen from the dead and become the first fruits of them that slept.
21. For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead.
22. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive.
23. But every man in his own order: Christ the first fruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming.
24. Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.
25. For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet.

26. The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death.
27. For he hath put all things under his feet. But when he saith all things are put under him, it is manifest that he is excepted, which did put all things under him.
28. And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him that put all things under him, that God may be all in all.
29. Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead, if the dead rise not at all? why are they then baptized for the dead?
30. And why stand we in jeopardy every hour?
